### MAJORITY LEADER NELSON: RECOVERY EFFORTS ARE WORKING

MADISON – Assembly Majority Leader Thomas Nelson (D-Kaukauna) announced today that Recovery dollars in Wisconsin have saved or created 22,100 Wisconsin jobs, and, according to the White House, are on track to create or save 70,000 jobs.

“Earlier this year, the state Assembly acted quickly to put federal Recovery dollars into action,” said Majority Leader Nelson. “These early reports clearly show that our recovery efforts are creating jobs and getting people back to work.”

In February, the state Assembly took action to invest Recovery funds in Wisconsin communities. According to an August USA Today report, Wisconsin was second in the nation in the efficient and timely implementation of Recovery funds.

“While our economic difficulties are far from over, the state Assembly has worked to improve our economy,” said Majority Leader Nelson. “These efforts are helping to create jobs and spur new economic growth.”

In addition to making key investments with Recovery funds, the state Assembly significantly increased job creation incentives in the state budget. These incentives have already helped companies like Mercury Marine and A & E Incorporated create and save thousands of jobs in Wisconsin.
